COVID symptoms

- loss of appetite
- chills or night sweats
- cough

- nausea and vomiting
- joint pain

Safety measures for our students

- Students years 3 to 6 are strongly encouraged to wear a mask
- Students will stay at home if unwell
- Students in years 1 to 6 will need to say good bye at the gates
- Drink stations are for bottle filling only
- Hygiene practices to continue with hand washing and sanitising
- Additional cleaning will occur
- No parents will be allowed to enter into buildings under any circumstance
- Weather permitting outside learning will occur
- Cross ventilation measures are in place
- Choir/excursions/music lessons are postponed
- Sports programs will not resume until after week 4 School of Languages commences

Safety measures for adults to attend to

- All adults/teachers will wear masks except when working with SWD or if it impedes teaching
- All adults/teachers will maintain social distancing
- Parents will not send unwell children to • school
- Parents will pick up unwell students within as short as possible time frame
- Parents will inform the school of any positive COVID cases
- Only one adult of a foundation students can come in the gates in the morning to drop their child at the drop off zone on the Junior Primary oval
- Siblings of foundation students will say goodbye at the gate
- At pick up adults to remain as far away from the buildings as possible and enter the grounds after 3pm
- Parents to leave with their child/ren ASAP. No play
- Communications at the front office will need to occur via phone or email

Actions if a positive case occurs within a classroom

- Parents of the COVID -19 child's class will be notified if a "classroom contact" has occurred
- Parents of non-effected students must monitor their child for symptoms
- If a child has symptoms parents must not send their child to school and get them tested as soon as possible
- If the child becomes positive please report case to school.
- Students without any symptoms are encouraged to continue attending school
- A "classroom contact" student is advised not to attend OSHC, extra-curricular activities for 7 days (such as camps, excursions, interschool sport, combined choir etc where possible for 7 days
- If a student tests positive to COVID-19, all people who live in that household must guarantine for 7 days (or 14 days if the household cannot separate).
- See -Testing, isolating and quarantine for school settings on our school's website.

Classroom contact:

When a student has shared a classroom or interacted with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 (teacher, SSO, ancillary staff or student).

The Chief Public Health Officer advises it is good practice for classroom contacts to do the following to minimise risk to others, when outside of the school:

- avoid high risk settings or COVID Management Plan events
- wear a surgical mask around others (where age appropriate) and outside your home
- avoid working across worksites unless an approved risk management plan is in place (e.g. rapid antigen testing)
- avoid contact with vulnerable people outside of your workplace or family, where possible
- avoid non-essential activities where possible (e.g. where there are lots people, inside, in close contact)
- avoid shared spaces and maintain physical distance.

House hold/community contact:

When a student has received a positive test as a result of being with people from outside the school community. All persons within the household must follow the directives from SA Health. The school must be notified.
